	frustrating issue with lots of meetings and little apparent	
	progress. It remains difficult to understand why the Council is	AL/JW
	prepared to spend over £100,000 on footpath maintenance while	
	ignoring the breach where a broken wall needs repair to save the

	pond from damaging seawater. This decision makes no sense	
	and needs change. Focus should be on what can be done to	
	rectify the situation instead of what cannot be done. AL/JW &	
	Peter Oliver will continue to press for answers.	
	Work will start on the footpath from 5 <sup>th</sup> August and will last	
	approximately five weeks. The beginning of work on the	
	Boardwalk is unclear and It was commented that no one has	
	seen a design or evidence of a planning application.	
7	Coastal Partners	
	The planning consultation process has completed with no major	
	issues. The flood defence project will now go forward to planning	
	in September It was noted costs had risen and now stood at	
	£23.7m. However, the funding gap remains.

8	Irreplaceable Habitats	
	SM raised the initiative from Plantlife to register grasslands as	
	Irreplaceable Habitats, alongside other protected ecosystems.	SM
	These grasslands are being lost and cannot easily be recreated in	
	a meaningful time frame. Thinking of possible benefit to	
	Southmere, we agreed to write to our MP encouraging support for	
	grasslands to be treated as priority habitats.
